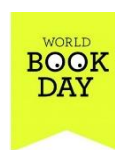

Year 1 had superhero day this week, all the children looked fantastic in their superhero costumes!



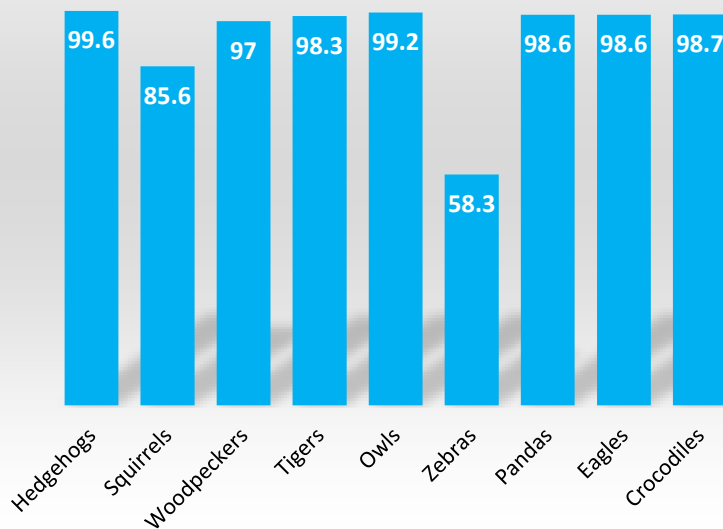
Leyton Orient Assembly
